We are asking for your help to continue this "march" forward to the future we seek to create: a nurturing community devoted to our youth.


This report gives a detailed accounting how we have provided that engagement in the last year. We happily seek your comments and suggestions as we hope to further improve and empower our efforts.





Deadline: April 1st






Mr. Kai Alexander Standifer of Simpsonville, was one of the 2017 LHC Scholarship winner.

The event is seeks to annually recognize and encourage 200-350 Greenville high school students to remain in school and pursue college. Greenville School District is a long-time partner with the program that has been conducted since 1977. High schools select students who have excel in school and seminars are held to prep for college. More than 5,000 students have received awards through this effort, and more 2,000 students have attended the Fair/Program.


In 2017, AGF sponsored a group of six (6) students to attend the institute.

If you are a champion for high risk and underprivileged youth in the community, you've likely heard of Stacey Ashmore. Stacey has worked in our community for more than 25 years. Many areas of his work consist of community patrol officers, decreasing gang activity, volunteering with programs at his church, support of the homeless by feeding, housing and clothing them. In addition, working in the Greenville Juvenile Detention Center and mentoring youth by "feeding" them both mentally and spiritually.

Additionally, his experience offers law enforcement, diversity, mental health training and instruction in the Call me MISTER Leadership training. Stacey currently serves as the Community Outreach Coordinator at Greenville Family Partnership, where he continues to work with other organizations and churches to support positive youth initiatives for youth at risk and youth in the Greenville Juvenile Detention Center.
